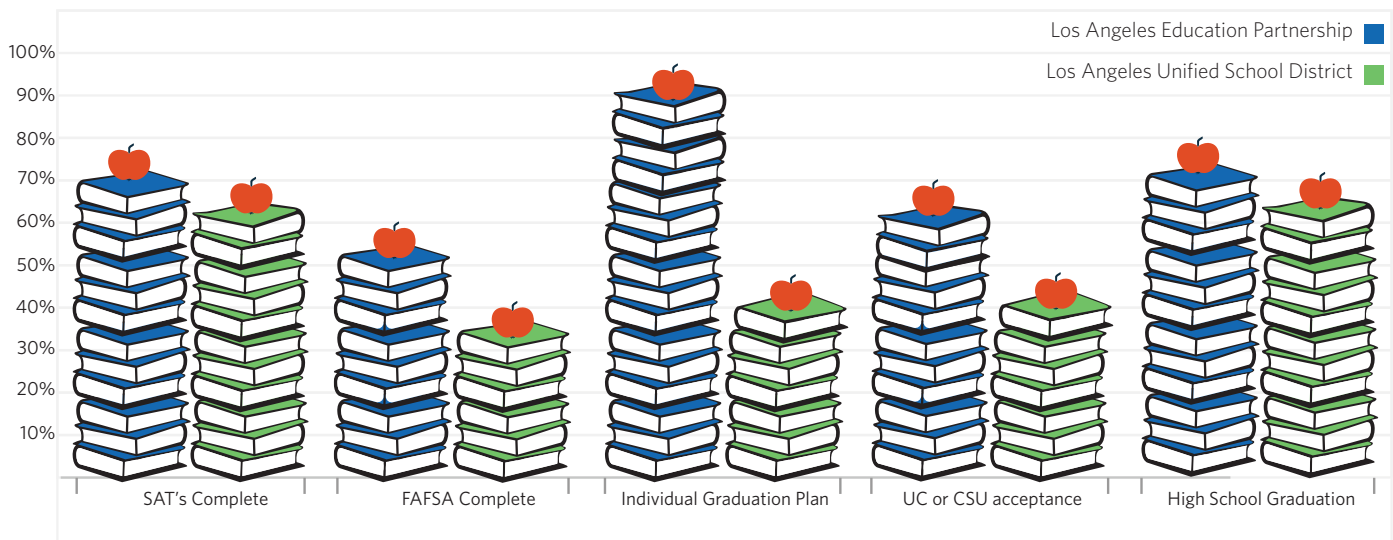

LAEP QUICK FACTS

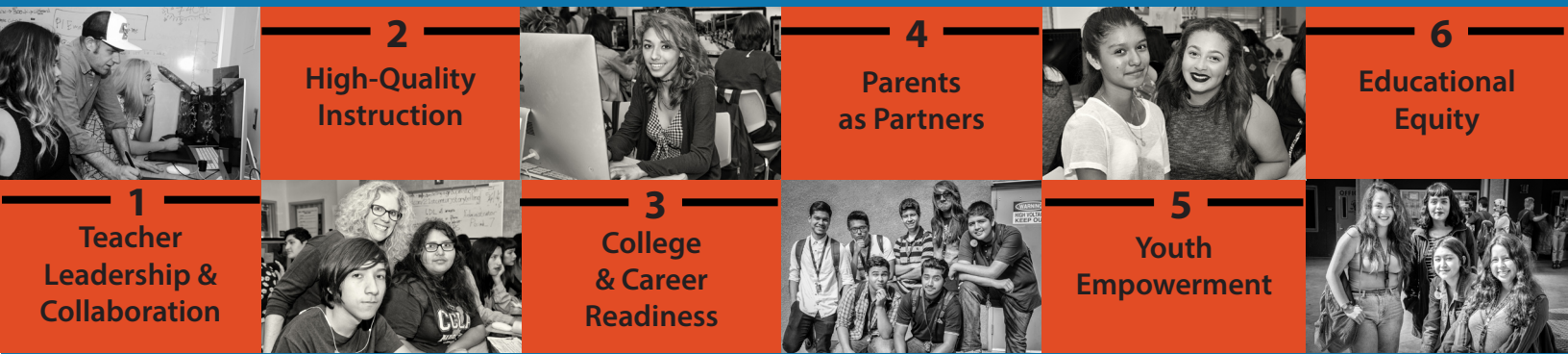
- LAEP Partner School Social Justice Humanitas Academy’s graduation rate was 95% compared to LAUSD’s overall rate of 82% in 2014-15.
- More than 1,200 students participated in college & career mock interviews with an industry professional in 2014-15.
- In LAEP’s Early Childhood program, 91% of parents improved how they helped their children with learning in 2014-15.
