Overall Impact in 2017

- LAEP impacted 14,000 students and their families, 759 educators on 11 LAUSD campuses in South L.A. & East L.A. & the Northeast Valley
- LAEP Partner Schools achieved a high-school graduation rate of 85% compared to LAUSD's graduation rate of 77%; the majority of LAEP students are English language learners and first generation college goers
- LAEP volunteers contributed more than 4,000 hours of time through LAEP events including reading buddies, college application workshops, mock interviews, student internships, and fundraising efforts

LAUSD and **other school districts** engaged LAEP's professional development services for 662 teachers and support staff in schools across Los Angeles and Northern California

LAEP's Early Head Start program visited 84 families on a weekly basis to address educational, emotional, social and health needs of both the children and the parents; 90% of children met age-specific developmental benchmarks after one year in the program
